other terminals. It was cold & slippery
& the paths for foot traffic were inadequate -
my purp was to see whether other
terminals had better facilities for eating - I
found they were all much alike, etc that
Eastern had an obviously expensive rest.,
which was not open, however - the
airport was almost deserted & ^{most} planes did
not take off until aft - I had a brief
conver w/ a couple from Chic who were
going to Moscow for a vacation

I had 2 cups of tea during the
day & lunch of roast chicken & green
beans w/ a glass of beer - we had beer
given \$10 for food & I had about a
dollar left

We had moved our luggage there,
first, to be in a better lounge & second,
to be nearer to our gate - Roosevelt
Turner & the two other girls did not

carry their share - the girls sulked all day & late in the aft Jewel expressed her opinion to them about their uncooperativeness

Harold was worried about the amt of luggage we had \downarrow - on the second plane we were limited to one piece - an lb \downarrow (as Barb & Marie had brot num. items)

bef flight time he checked w/ the airline officials - they th the extra pieces in the luggage comparten brot made an additional charge - Harold & Jewel were busy on the arrangements until almost the last minute & I was afraid they weren't going to be able to board

The second flight left at 3⁰⁰ - the plane was crowded - we had to squeeze up to take off & were at least a half hr late

My seating companion was a business-man going to Trinidad - I replied to his questions about my destination by saying I was going to Guyana on a teaching mission for my church, P.T. Dis of Chr - he did not seem to recognize
