Yvonne Sly was at the controls of the boat, Tim Swinney & Davis Solomon helping him - we steered out to the ocean & went along the coast

I went to bed about 8⁰⁰ - my blanket was in the hold so I used a pair of overalls of Roosevelt for cover & the red

of his luggage for a pillow - the other
passengers had been given Dramamine^s
but I didn't take any - the crew was

deck & stayed for a while & felt all right
the rest of the night - slept well
