Got up at 5⁰⁰ to go to the bathroom, again
at 7⁰⁰ - slept until 8⁰⁰

Got up just before we came to the mouth
of the river - Rich. & Tim were up -
Djane explained the route we were taking

At 9³⁰ we stopped at Morehama Village
to register w/ police - we were on the
Morehama River

For breakfast we had coffee, pen cakes & syrup
The day was cloudy w/ little rain & we
liked the jungle growth along the river,
occas. saw Amerind huts & people

About 2⁰⁰ those who wished helped
themselves to a cheese sandwich

We arrived at Port Kaituma^S at 3⁰⁰ having
made excellent time - we were so early that
the people were not there to meet us -

Davis started to walk but had the tractor
on the way - the tractor pulled a trailer
to carry us & all that came off the boat

Personnel were unloaded from the
boat first - some of the luggage was so
w/ us - then it was decided to send the
rest of it later & we were taken to Jones-
town - it is 7 mi. to the central pt of the
mission

11⁰⁰ as the pigs had to be taken off - they
had stood the trip well, w/ the exception of

We were given a warm welcome by
our friends

Our luggage was assembled under a
green tent to be checked through by us
before take it - we were warned that
all thro, bags & items for other people

I was talking to people when Jo's voice was
heard on the loudspeaker from the Radio Hut -
he mentioned he saw Edith Butler who
"had fled from the CIA & taken refuge
w/ us" - a crowd assembled in front
of the hut, I among them

I was confronting an older man, ob-
viously a drinker type - the man had
asked ~~Barrett~~ Turner for liquor or
money to buy liquor - he had told
Turner lies about children being poisoned
(some children had gotten hold of
insecticide & would have died but I
miraculously saved them) & had also
told Turner that "you can't get out of
Jonestown" - Turner was then put on
the floor - his squandering of money was
brought up - Rocky Briedenbeth was also

hurt & I felt miserable - someone took me
to a warehouse to get what they had which
was a towel & washcloth - but sheet was
not available

I ran into some... who showed

number of his room note who told me
she showed me where to shower & find
the cottage to which it was assigned...
Touchette made the assignment...
of age & evidently the cottages are
more spacious than the dorms -
The dorms are near the central area -
stage 48 to which I am assigned as well
- the first row, next to the clearing - there
are 4, 2-level bunks & a loft - there were
only 3 occupants - one was being Lundquist -
I didn't know the others
